Getting Started:

- 1. Did your family celebrate Father's Day this year? In what way?
- 2. What images/response do you have to the term "father"?



Into the Bible:

Read Job 1:1-5

- 3. How is Job portrayed in the opening verses of the book that bears his name? (vss. 1-3)
- 4. From vss 4, 5, comment on
 - a. Job's qualities as a father
 - b. His role as an intercessor/mediator between God and his children

Read Psalm 1

5. Vss 1-3 describe the man (or person) who is "blessed". While this psalm does not refer specifically to fathers, noting vs. 3 particularly, consider the influence such a man may have in his family.

- 6. Psalm 1 is a psalm of contrasts. How are the wicked described? (4, 5)
- 7. The contrast is quite black and white! Why do you think things sometimes appear to be more "grey" these days?

Read Ephesians 6:4

- 3. As fathers, what kind of things do we sometimes do that may "exasperate" our children?
- 9. Paul offers us an alternative! Practically speaking, how do we "bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord"?



Digging Deeper:

- 10. In an Old Testament setting, Job sacrificed burn offerings for each of his children. What twenty-first century equivalent is available to fathers in our time?
- 11. How important is the father's role as intercessor for his family?
- 12. How may we better pray for our children?
